Preparations for Restoration Projects – Summer 2012

Excerpts of the successful trip by the HFPJC Board members, to prepare cemetery projects

• **Kobryn, Belarus:** At first, the HFPJC board arrived to the Kobryn cemetery, resting site of Rabbi Moshe Kobryn'er zt"l, in a joint effort with the Asra Kadisha to determine the precise cemetery borders in preparation for the fence construction. It's opportune to mention that a fence is urgently needed to secure the site, which is in danger of being appropriated in the process of the recent real estate development in that area.

• A successful meeting was held at the office of the deputy mayor, where the future plans of the cemetery were discussed, with subsequent applications of the needed permits. The deputy mayor assured his support with the bureaucratic details of the project. The project is now dependent on the generous donations of klal yisroel!

• **Szczebrzeszyn, Poland:** The following stopover was at the ancient cemetery in Szczebrzeszyn, which is on Avoyseinu's agenda for an extended time. The HFPJC Board met with the contractor on the cemetery site and reviewed the many details involved in the eventual success of the project. Presently, a thorough cleanup is being scheduled to prepare the commencement of the work.

• **Narol, Poland:** Further preparations were also made at the Narol cemetery with the attendance of the contractor and HFPJC Board members. A thorough assessment was made on site to determine the precise borders, which had been uncertain due to a nearby street side that was built on cemetery property.

• **Mogliena, Poland:** At last, the group of askanim arrived to the cemetery in Mogliena, where historical gravestones were found at a recent evaluation. The borders were reviewed once again according to visible fundamentals of the original fence. At the end, the HFPJC Board members utilized this sublime opportunity to pray at the holy gravesites for continued success in their noble endeavors.
